## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### **Student-free days 2018**

Each year, schools receive four student-free days (when student instruction does not occur) for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development and student assessment and reporting.

The first day of Term 1 each year is always a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students.

School councils have the flexibility to schedule the remaining three student-free days each year to meet local school needs. In order to allow parents and caregivers plenty of time to make plans, School Council has approved the dates for our next two student-free days.

In order to support the implementation of our BYOD program and to ensure that technology is being used effectively throughout the school to support and improve learning, we will be using one of our student-free days this year for a differentiated ICT day, where staff who have different levels of understanding can be catered for and where we can offer a variety of different workshops throughout the day. This day is to be held on Friday May 11th.

The third student-free day this year will be used for our three-way conferences where parents and caregivers come to school with their child to meet with the teacher to discuss learning, achievement and goal setting. Teachers stay into the evening on this day to accommodate parents who are unable to attend during the day. The date will be Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> June which is the last Wednesday of term.

We have not scheduled our fourth student-free day as yet however it is likely to be in term 3.

### Good neighbours

Thank-you to everyone for showing patience and consideration at school pick up times, it is assisting in keeping our children as safe as possible.

As a member of the local community, we also need to ensure we are acting responsibly and considerately towards our neighbours at school pick up time. When parking, please just check that you are not blocking a driveway, parking in the hospital carpark where patients or staff need to park or in guest parking bays in the nearby apartments.

### School Council vacancy

We would like to welcome back to School Council Michael Scully who works for the Shire of Mornington and has been co-opted onto School Council as a community member for 2018.

### BEING ACTIVELY INVOLVED IN YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AND THEIR SCHOOL

Schools, parents, and the community should work together to promote the health, wellbeing, and learning of all students. When schools actively involve parents and engage community resources they are able to respond more effectively to the health-related needs of students.

Family and community involvements foster partnerships among schools, family and community groups and individuals. These partnerships result in sharing and maximizing resources and they help children and youth develop healthy behaviours and promote healthy families.

Research shows that students whose parents are involved in their education are more likely to:

- Adapt well to school
- Attend school more regularly
- Complete homework more consistently
- Earn higher grades and test scores
- Graduate and go on to college



- Have better social skills
- Show improved behaviour
- Have better relationships with their parents
- Have higher self-esteem



Additionally, linking community activities to the classroom

- Improves school-related behaviours
- Positively impacts academic achievement
- Reduces school suspension rate

#### **7 Tips to becoming actively involved:**

- Build Relationships – with teachers and other parents
- Make the most of parent teacher meetings.
- Create a rich learning environment at home.
- Get connected – read weekly newsletters, check classroom notices
- Join Parents Associations
- Join School Council
- Join a Subcommittee

**STS** : Lenny Garnar for being balanced and reflective by taking control of his emotions and making great choices.

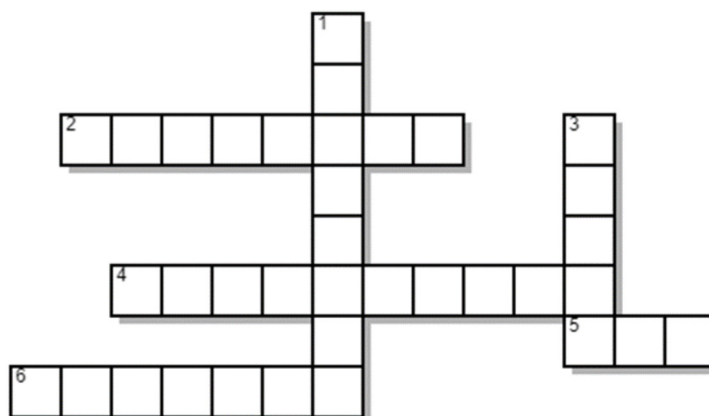

## Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Mornington Primary School is excited to be participating. The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 7 September 2018.

**Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.**

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and can choose to have their name included on the online Honour Roll. If you would like your child's name to appear on the Honour Roll, please sign the attached form and return it to your school.

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Definitions:** *Department* refers to the Victorian Department of Education and Training, *Person* refers to the child/adult listed below in the consent declaration.

#### Privacy Protection

Publish your child's name on its online Honour Roll located at: [www.education.vic.gov.au/prc](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/prc) at the completion of the Challenge with no other identifying factors such as early childhood setting name.

#### Accuracy, access to information and withdrawal of consent

The Department will endeavour to ensure that any personal information held about your child is up to date and accurate. You can access, correct and withdraw personal information held by the Department by written request in accordance with the Department's Information Privacy Policy located at:
